ery often classroom research conclusions cannot go beyond statements of statistical significance or extensive ording that may not render sufficient understanding of why he resulted patterns really happen. This is also the case for most of analyses of classroom teaching activities. This chenomena happen mostly due to lacks of appropriate and curate analysis foci, especially that of the language used in the teacher-student interaction, i.e. classroom discourse, volved in their engagement in teaching-learning processes.

e significance of employing classroom discourse analysis has ong been echoed since the beginning of 1970. Sinclair and Coulthard's work (1975) has been very seminal for further development of discourse analysis frameworks. However, efforts in TESL, TEFL or TESOL contexts have not been extensive, especially in line with Hallidayan tradition of temic linguistics. This book presents one of the alternatives that suits the need. Based on Sinclair and Coulthard's mework and critical understanding of the nature of ESL/EFL aching, the writer offers an analysis framework that enables analysts to go deep into the intricacy of language teaching-learning processes.
